British-based Olympic New Zealand rider Tim Price (43) won the event in 2018, riding Ringwood Sky Boy, finishing fifth in 2019 on Bango. His entries this year are Bango, Vitali and Polystar 1. Tim, who is based near Marlborough in Wiltshire where he runs a competition yard with his wife Jonelle, is currently #2 in the FEI World Rider ranking.

Tim grew up on a farm in Oxford, North Canterbury, in the South Island of New Zealand. Surrounded by horses from an early age, it seemed natural that Tim would follow a career into horses. He showjumped to World Cup level before deciding that as the majority of the horses he was working with were New Zealand Thoroughbreds they were naturally more suited to eventing. With the NZ thoroughbred Vortex, Tim won the CC12* at the National Championships in New Zealand. The pair went on to compete at four-star level and also won back-to-back Retraining of Racehorses Championships at Barbury Castle (2012/13).

Tim and Jonelle (Richards) began dating in 2001 and two years later with their advanced horses Desamoray and Mazetto came to the UK to prepare for Burghley, with the aim of competing at the 2004 Athens Olympics. In 2004 both horses went to Badminton and the pair relocated to their current base in the UK the following year. In 2014 Tim won his first four-star (now five-star) at Luhmühlen with Wesko with whom he previously won at CCI one, and three-star level (Blair Castle). The pair was a member of the NZ team for the 2014 WEG.

Tim and Jonelle married in New Zealand, in 2013 – they now have a five-year-old son Otis and a two-year-old daughter, Abel. Tim's brother Cam is CEO of Keyflow Horse feeds and his brother Brad is a 'genuine cowboy in Australia'. Tim trains with British dressage rider and international judge Isobel Wessells and Luis Alvarez Cervera. Outside of eventing he loves travel, camping, skiing, golfing and dangerous sports.

Bango, (aka Uno) owned by the Numero Uno syndicate, is a 16-year-old Irish Sport Horse (ISH) gelding. Bred by James Foley he is by Garrison Royal (a son of Cavalier Royale) out of No Sale by Don Tristan. He came to the yard to be broken and never left. The pair was 10th at Burghley in 2018 and 5th in 2019.

Vitali, owned by Joe & Alex Giannamore, is a 12-year-old German-bred gelding. Bred by Filemann Guenther he is by Contender out of Noble Lady I who in turn is by Heraldik. He placed 10th at Luhmühlen CCI5*L this year and was Tim's ride at the Tokyo Olympic Games, where the pair finished 24th. His favourite occupation is apparently rolling in mud.

Polystar I, owned by Trisha Rickards, is a 17-year-old Belgian-bred. He is by Polytraum out of Waldbeere, by Waldstar. Tim took over the ride from Chris Burton this year. The pair placed second at Strzegom 4*L in June, after finishing 24th at Millstreet 3*S three weeks previously. This will be his first 5*L competition.
